May the Lord who brought us this far, work through our lives and enable us to fulfil his purposes in our lives and institution to become a true place of healing and care to a hurting world.



New facilities like the Blood Centre, Occupational Therapy, Neuro Electrophysiology, Prosthetics and Orthotics added much needed impetus towards patient care and services.

The department runs DNB Medicine course and has 6 trainees.

The department conducts journal club every Wednesdays and case presentations every Thursdays and few CMEs. Dr Imnanaro is involved in teaching the M Med students and Ayush doctors.

Intensive Care Unit (ICU) is seeing a major improvement with standard protocol being developed ICU and mentoring by Dr Manju (critical care medicine ) and nursing staff headed by Ms Theyiesinuo (Msc Nursing).

Emergency UGI endoscopies for critical patients can be done in our ICU without having to be shifted to diagnostic block.

Our department has set up Neurolab which is able to do Nerve Conduction Study(NCV), Electromyography (EMG), Evoke potential etc.

Our diagnostic Bronchoscopy is gradually being revived and our old dysfunctional PFT machine got replaced with a new one. We are able to do chronic tunnelled haemodialysis catheter(Permcath) insertion as day care bedside procedure thereby reducing the cost significantly for Chronic Kidney Disease patients.

Our Diabetic clinic will be restructured and we plan to develop it into a comprehensive diabetes care centre for North East.

Both families are delighted to see the children normal again.

## SPARROW TRANSPORT SERVICE

The Sparrow Transport Service (Safe Pediatirc Acute Response and Retrieval on Wheels) is a Level 3 children's Critical Care transport service. Initiated by the Pediatric Critical Care Unit of CIHSR head by Dr. Wonashi Tsanglao, to carry out transfer of critically ill children from PHC's, CHC, and any other health facilities in and around Dimapur to our Pediatric /Neonatal ICU.

Scope: The SPARROW Service will transfer infants and children below 16 years of age including neonates. The transport team includes a doctor trained to handle critically ill children, a nurse with PICU/NICU experience and a dedicated ambulance driver. The Service was launched in 2023.

So far we have safely transported 5 Paediatric patients using the Sparrow Transport service.

## **New Services for PICU/NICU**

As part of the expansion of services offered by the Paediatric department, two new services were added to the existing services offered by the PICU/NICU.

• Therapeutic Cooling: This is a specialized service for treatment of Term Newborn infants who suffer from significant perinatal asphyxia. By cooling the core temperature of the baby the metabolic demands of the newborn Brain is decreased and thereby reducing the damage from hypoxic damage.

**Scope:** Newborns term infants with Perinatal asphyxia who reach our hospital within 6 hours of delivery.

- **Incubator:** This is a special New born closed circuit warmer for the care of very low birth weight and extreme preterm babies.
- **Bio-safety Cabinet:** A special secure and sterile place for preparing iv fluids and especially designed for preparing Total Parenteral Nutrition. The Laminar flow within the cabinet is designed to reduce the chance of contamination and thereby reduce infection.

- Volite injection for facial rejuvenation
- MNRF (micro-needling Radiofrequency) for scar repair
- Mandelic peel for post-acne scars/Melasma with Acne





## **Training & Wrokshops**

Prof (Dr.) Regi Thomas Dept of ENT , Skull Base Surgery, CMC, Vellore mentored and gave hands on training on Endoscopic Sinus Surgery to our team. We also organized CME on Endoscopic Sinus Surgery for all ENT surgeons of the Nagaland.

ENT dept also participated in the Allied Health Education Fair and our stall won the Best Stall Award. We also celebrated the World Hearing Day with the theme "Ear and Hearing for all! Let's make it a reality." We also dedicated the first Beraphone in the state for Screening of Newborn for hearing.

In an effort to improve patient care and communication, several staffs from the department attended various workshops and seminar in Mumbai and in Shillong.



The department of Developmental Pediatrics since 2014 has grown to be an established name in the area of Intellectual and Developmental and Disabilities (IDD) providing help to families of children with disabilities in Nagaland and even across the state.

The OPD consultations consists of

- Complete Developmental assessment
- Psychometric tests like IQ test
- Screening and diagnosis of developmental conditions
- Parental counselling and support services.

The Precious Gems School provides 3 months of intervention program and takes in 16 children in two batches: The team conducts workshops and seminars in an around Nagaland to Churches, School Teachers, NGO's and Community.

It provides curative and promotive mental health services, in the community. Services provided:

- 1. Assessment and Diagnosis of Developmental and Intellectual Disabilities
- 2. Special school training for children with disabilities from Precious Gems school
- 3. Family support and Counselling services
- 4. Workshops and seminars for school teachers and parents

# **Embracing Autism: A Journey of Hope**

Neivi, a 4 year old girl was brought to the Developmental Pediatrics OPD by her parents with the complaints of "poor speech and language, always in her own world and temper tantrums". She came from a family history of Intellectual disability in Maternal and Paternal Uncles.

Following is the write-up of Neivi's mother about her experience in Precious Gems School.

My daughter Neivi (Keneivinuo) is 11 years old and studies in Class 5. She is bubbly, talkative and likes to draw. Neivi was diagnosed to have autism at 3 years of age.

Autism is not a disease. It is not a mental health issue or any illness that can be fixed with medicines. It is something that a person is born with and that individual is wired differently and perceives the world differently. Acceptance is the first step towards transformation and improvement. Sometimes the most effective adjustments occur by accepting what already is.

Under the guidance of Dr. Y Simpson and his team, Neivi and I started our special classes at Precious Gems School and from the get-go, the team at Precious Gems were very helpful and supportive.

Today, Neivi likes to participate in poetry recitation, science exhibitions and makes it to the toppers list in Class.

The Community Health Department (CHD) conducts outreach programs in Dhansiripar block of Dimapur district and Medziphema block in Chumukedima district in partnership with the Department of Health and Family Welfare, Government of Nagaland through Terms of Reference (ToR) since 2010.

## DHANSIRIPAR BLOCK, DIMAPUR DISTRICT

Community Based Mental Health Program Mental Health for All (MeHeFA)

The program commenced from 1 August 2021 in Dhansiripar block in 17 villages. As of March 2023, 72 persons with various mental disorders were identified, assessed and followed up at regular intervals through field visits, provision of counseling, psychotherapy, medication where required to the beneficiary and support to the caregivers as well. As part of the program, 36 Mental Health Awareness seminars were also conducted regularly among 526 women from Self Help Groups (SHG) belonging to the Nagaland State Rural Livelihood Mission (NSRLM).

## MEDZIPHEMA BLOCK, CHUMUKEDIMA DISTRICT

Health Awareness Program on Non Communicable Disease (NCD)

The Health Awareness Program on NCD in partnership with the Nagaland State Rural Livelihood Mission (NSRLM) was planned for implementation in 2023 following the signing of Memorandum of Understanding.

## **NIULAND DISTRICT**

Community Based Health Program

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic during 2020-2021, the partnership program with the Western Sumi Akukukhou Kuqhakulu (WSBAK) was cancelled due to various reasons. For this matter, recommendation was sought from the Nagaland Baptist Church Council for alternative areas.



#### **ACTIVTIES**

- A Health Awareness and Health promotion program was organized in Indo-Myanmar Border at Wanglee Market, Kamjong District, Manipur India in collaboration with missionaries of Poumai Naga Baptist Association and Amazing Grace Mission School, Wanglee Market. We got the opportunity to conduct health promotion activities with people living in village, truck drivers and students in schools and hostels.
- CLHTC 2nd Contact program for 15 days was conducted in Kolkata for 22 Missionaries of Charity sisters and we could facilitate the training program in collaboration with CMC Vellore distance education department.
- We organized a one-day training program on the theme "Best Out of Waste" in collaboration with ANMA Integrated Development Association (AIDA) in AIDA Training Hall, Don Bosco Campus, Dimapur, Nagaland.
- Income Generating Skill Training for 3 days with around 20 different types of skills. 23 participants from various NGO's, FBO's from Nagaland, Assam, Siliguri, Sikkim could attend the sessions
- CLHTC convocation cum Trainer refresher's program was organized in CMC Vellore and CLHTC trainers attended the program.
- Health promotion program focus on Men's fellowship with more than 140 members in Old Showuba Baptist Church.
- Community Health Promoters Certificate Course with Kuki Baptist Convention youths. 24 participants completed the 1st contact program.
- 17 trainees completed the Basic Cutting Tailoring Course in 3 months duration. 4 Trainees completed Ladies Design Course in 6 months duration.




The Palliative Care department works in line with the vision of CIHSR providing accessible, affordable, inclusive, compassionate and a good quality of service. Our goal is to ensure patients and their families to receive the best possible palliative care and we ensure our work reaches health professionals, patients, care givers and the community through our outpatient department, inpatient department and home based care services.



In the past year we have joined hands with the St. Joseph Palliative Care centre and supported them by our weekly visits to the centre and providing consultations and treatment for their admitted patients. We developed our training programme through Education department collaborating with the Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship, Guwahati to train "Care-givers" for elderly people and patients with palliative care needs.

The department of Radiation Oncology participated in various events and programs during the year April 2022-March 2023. Some of the noteworthy events are cervical cancer month in January 2023. Free pap smears were offered to the public, education sessions were held for patients and their families as they waited in OPD, and the month culminated in an academic session with a CME where surgeons, oncologists and pathologists of various institutions participated.

In April 2023, head and neck cancer month was observed which involved multiple departments coming together to screen the general population for cancer, an awareness program with the jawans and IRB, Dimapur which included memorable speeches by the Director of CIHSR, Dr. Sedevi Angami and by the Additional Director and State Nodal Officer, Tobacco Control, Dr. C. Tetseo and finally a CME/ symposium on head and neck cancer was held with many prominent national speakers with interesting case discussions.

In September 2022, a CME on carcinoma nasopharynx was held where various doctors, including Dr. Rajesh Isaih, Senior Consultant, Radiation Oncologist was a speaker.

The department also took part in two major multi-institution projects during this time period. One was a quality improvement project that was organized by the National Cancer Grid, in collaboration with EQUIP India and Stanford University of Medicine.

Dr. Paul Ravindran, Principal of AHS and Senior Radiation Officer was invited as a speaker for notable national conferences and events like AMPICON, AROICON, some at CMC Vellore, as well as a faculty for teaching courses including the FRCR course at Tata Memorial Centre Kolkata, and as an advisor to IAEA in Thailand and various other occasions. The department was awarded the best performing department by the Ayushman Bharat PMJAY health scheme in the Dimapur district on 2.7.2023.





# NagaEd: Digital learning platform for healthcare educators



The NagaEd organized a two-day Teacher Training Course "Digital Learning for Teachers: Navigating NagaEd LMS" through facilitated live workshops for training and assessment assistance for CIHSR educator trainees on the 26th and 27th of October 2022 at CIHSR.

This was designed to build educators' skills in digital content development with the purpose of ensuring the users are well-equipped with the features and functionalities of the NagaEd Learning Management system (LMS). A total of twenty educator trainees were enrolled to be trained on the features and functionalities of the NagaEd LMS.

An agreement with NagaEd was signed on 22 October 2022 for the Implementation of the NagaEd LMS as an effort to build and enhance digital learning at CIHSR. Teacher graduation was organised on 24th November 2022 and the educator trainees were awarded a training completion certificate.

At present, five courses: College of Nursing (2 courses: B.Sc. Nursing and GNM course), Allied Health Sciences (B.MLT), DNB, and Post Diploma in Clinical Educator courses are enrolled on the platform.



The COP served as a platform for students to apply their academic learning in real-world scenarios, fostering a holistic approach to healthcare education.



CIHSR was accredited for three (3) DNB Post MBBS Broad Specialty courses initiated by the National Board of Examinations & Medical Sciences (NBEMS), New Delhi in Family Medicine since 2013, General Medicine and General Surgery since 2016. DNB Post MBBS & DNB Post Diploma seats in Paediatrics were accredited in 2021 and two DNB Diplomas in Anaesthesia and Obstetrics & Gynaecology in 2022.

## RESEARCH IN CIHSR

The Institutional Review Board (IRB) comprising of Ethics and Scientific committee reviews all studies conducted in CIHSR. Our studies encompass the field of epidemiology, public health, oncology, emerging diseases (infectious and non-infectious) and mental health. The Ethics Committee was provisionally registered to the Department of Health Research (DHR), Ministry of Health and Family Welfare in December 2020. The IRB facilitates research ethics trainings and workshops for its members and staffs. The full board review meeting is conducted four times in a year (February, May, August and November), while the Scientific Committee sits monthly for expedited review. For the period 2022-2023, there was a total of 12 research articles published, in the area of tuberculosis, mental health, antimicrobial resistance, oncology and Al.

During this period, the IRB has reviewed a total of 27 studies. Among these, there are 4 (four) collaborative studies, two funded by Indian council of Medical research (ICMR) and two international cohort study. A total of 23 studies are intramural, of which 13 studies are dissertations being carried out in the Department of Medicine, Surgery, Paediatrics and Family medicine for DNB degree. Two studies have been completed and one was published in 2023.







# LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT




