CIHSR is in it's 17th year of existence. The last year has been eventful with several initiatives taking place.

Academics - The Allied Health Sciences College finally got its official recognition from the Nagaland University. Anaesthesiology degree course was upgraded in the DNB Post Graduate program. Research has taken off with several papers being published by our staff in National and International papers.

Infrastructure - The MRI was installed. The 5G Lab was granted to CIHSR from the Dept of Telecommunications, Govt of India. The PK John-Multipurpose Building was completed and is now being used for sporting activities and institutional functions by our staff and students.

People – Several personal formation processes were initiated with Dr. MC Mathew, Dr. Varghese Philip and Dr. Sheila Varghese who strengthened the process of reflection and retreats to enable our staff to develop in their spiritual and personal life.

Processes – We completed our 3rd Strategic Plan process across the institute and started implementing the various initiatives. The new salary revision was implemented satisfactorily. We remain grateful to our supporting partners: EHA, CMC Vellore, Bangalore Baptist Hospital and the Nagaland Government for their continuous support and encouragement in the growth of CIHSR. We have been blessed by our Lord Jesus Christ to be a blessing to our neighbours and region.






Emergency UGI endoscopies for critical patients can be done in our ICU without having to be shifted to diagnostic block.


Our department has set up Neurolab which is able to do Nerve Conduction Study(NCV), Electromyography (EMG), Evoke potential etc.

Our diagnostic Bronchoscopy is gradually being revived and our old dysfunctional PFT machine got replaced with a new one. We are able to do chronic tunnelled haemodialysis catheter(Permcath) insertion as day care bedside procedure thereby reducing the cost significantly for Chronic Kidney Disease patients.

Our Diabetic clinic will be restructured and we plan to develop it into a comprehensive diabetes care centre for North East.

The **Cardiology Department** is a young department that has been growing steadily over the past 2 years. It is actively performing life-saving acute coronary interventions and conduction system support implants, as well as optimal medical therapy for various ardiac disorders ranging from heart failure to cardiac arrhythmias. We are the only cardiac centre with the facilities to provide such care in the state.



The **Department of Dermatology** has been functioning since November 2007. The department caters to both out-patients and in-patients and sees 50 patients on average per day. The number of procedures done per month has been steadily maintained at around 400 procedures in a month.

The department has been a pioneer in the field of LASER, Botox, thread lifts and dermal fillers within the state, and houses 3 different types of LASERs with the state-of-the-art Fractional CO2 LASER. The department takes a keen interest in keeping abreast with the latest updates and has presented Academic papers at various national and international conferences. The department also routinely participates in providing community dermatological services with the Community Health Department of the Institute. Besides these activities, the Department is involved in School Health Education in collaboration with the Community Health Department and the Community Health Nursing Department, College of Nursing(CON), CIHSR.

Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation (PM&R), also known as Rehabilitation Medicine, is a branch of medicine which focuses on restoring functional ability and enhancing quality of life using medical management, physical therapies and supportive devices. PMR involves a multi-disciplinary professional team consisting of: Physiatrist (PMR Doctor); Rehabilitation Nurse; Physiotherapist (PT); Occupational therapist (OT); Orthotist and Prosthetist (P&O and social and vocational worker).

New services: Botox injection for the management of spasticity, C- arm guided Selective Nerve block, nerve block for spasticity management, Trigger point block injections and nerve block for chronic musculoskeletal pain, ultrasound screening of intramuscular cyst and management.

Achievements: PMR Department along with the Rehabilitation team celebrated the 1st international Disability day at CIHSR on 4th December, 2024 as an institution.

The **Neuro Rehabilitation Stroke Clinic** started in February 2024 focuses on post stroke care and management, and functional outcome.



Prosthetic and Orthotic Unit

Prosthetics and Orthotics (P&O) in CIHSR is a unit that is well underway. The initiation of the department began in the month of April 2023. Planning and the layout for the building of P&O was made after which the construction had begun. The construction is expected to be completed by end of the year 2024.







The **Ophthalmology Department** was started in November 2012 under the able hands of Dr. Sushil Daniel and has since been growing in every aspect to provide quality eye care in this region. The department provides services like comprehensive eye examination, refraction, glaucoma screening, diabetic retinopathy screening, dry eye screening and diagnosis alongwith treatment of other eye problems. The department performs surgeries like Phacoemulsificataion cataract surgery, Pterygium surgery, Entropion/ ectropion correction, DCR/DCT and other eye problems needing surgery.

The department also routinely participates in providing Community Ophthalmology services with the Community Health Department of the Institute. The Department is involved in school eye screening programme in collaboration with the Community Health Department.

There has been a steady growth in the number of eye surgical cases with the majority of cases operated being Phacoemulsification cataract surgery.

Future Plans and Aspirations

- The Department plans to start Bsc.Optometry course with an aim to train mission minded students to reach out and provide eye care in remote inaccessible places in Nagaland.
- With adequate man-power, to actively participate in Community Ophthalmology to meet the eye care needs in the community
- To Re-start the School Eye Screening Programme.



The **Dental Department** provides Dental treatments for both genders, geriatrics, adults and children. It deals with all walks of life, not just giving back smiles but also the functionality of the body as a whole.

The procedures/treatment performed and provided are as follows:

- **1.0ral Surgery:** Exodontic surgeries, Disimpactions (including cancer/ radiation patients), splintings, coronectomy, Flab surgeries, incisions & drainage of abscess, curettage.
- 2. Endodontics: Root Canal Treatments, pulpotomies.
- **3. Conservative treatments:** Restorations-tooth colored, silver, metal crowns, ceramic crowns, Porcelain Fused to Metal crowns.
- **4. Periodontics:** Oral Prophylaxis –Scaling & root plannings.
- **5. Prosthodontics:** Complete dentures and removable partial dentures-acrylic dentures, flexible dentures, crowns and bridges, obturators, dental casts and models, NAM(Naso alveolar moulding device,nasal elevators).
- **6. Orthodontic Treatments:** Fixed Braces, Removable simple hawleys appliances, retentive appliances.
- **7.Pedodontic procedures**: Pulpectomies, Pulpotomies, fluoride releasing fillings, tooth colored fillings, stainless steel crowns, extractions of deciduous teeth.
- 8. Inpatient Dental Consultations & managements.
- 9. Oral medicine & Dental X-rays-IOPA, bitewings.

The **Community Health Department** (CHD) conducts outreach projects with specific focus on health promotion, prevention and curative services among poor, disadvantaged and marginalized communities living in rural and hilly areas.

From 2011, the department focused on Strengthening the Primary Health Care Programs in Dhansiripar block in partnership with the Department of Health and Family Welfare Government of Nagaland. In 2021, the Community Based Mental Health Program was introduced and this was followed by the Health Awareness Program on Non-Communicable Diseases (NCD) in 2023 in Medziphema block, with additional partnership from the Nagaland State Rural Livelihood Mission (NSRLM), Government of Nagaland.

DHANSIRIPAR BLOCK (A). Community Based Mental Health Program

During 2023-2024, 75 individuals with various mental disorders were assessed and followed up at regular intervals through field visits, provision of counseling, psychotherapy and medication to the beneficiaries and support to caregivers in 19 villages. The HELPLINE assisted in maintaining communication with the caregivers. Mental Health Awareness Seminars were also conducted regularly among women Self Help Groups (SHG) in all the villages.



MEDZIPHEMA BLOCK (B). Health Awareness Program on Non-Communicable Diseases (NCD)

The project covers all 23 villages scattered in the valley and hilly regions of the block. The activities commenced in January 2024 with the training of various government health cadres and NSRLM staff on Non-Communicable Diseases and the Program Implementation Strategy in Medziphema block. Following this, the Health Awareness Seminars were conducted among the communities on Non-Communicable Diseases, Risk Factors, Lifestyle Modifications and appropriate medical care.



Dengue Awareness Campaign 2023

In response to the alarming rise in the number of people affected by the Dengue outbreak in Dimapur during the year, the 'Dengue Awareness Campaign 2023, Fight the Bite, Beat Dengue' was conducted by the Christian Institute of Health Sciences and Research (CIHSR) in partnership with the National Vector Borne Disease Control Programme (NVBDCP), Nagaland Health Mission, Government of Nagaland, on 21 and 22 September 2023 at CIHSR.

Future Plans

The Community Health Department envisions the implementation of outreach activities even in other unreached areas of Nagaland where communities will benefit from the community health and development programs through awareness, empowerment and sustainable health practices.



Outreach Service Department existed as a very small invisible department since 2019 in CIHSR. As a young and very new existing department, we have only three members in the department with 2 nurses and one skill trainer cum health promoter.

The department provides Primary Healthcare Training courses for the lay- leaders in community in collaboration with CMC Vellore Distance Education Department. The courses are Community Lay-Leaders Health Training Certificate Course (CLHTC) and Community Health Promoters Certificate Course (CHPC). Students from various faith based organizations, NGOs, seminaries undergo basic health promotion as well as income generation skills training. The department also organizes participatory programs for people living with chronic health issues such as alcoholism, terminal cancer, kidney failure and mental health issues.

Activities

Health awareness and health promotion program was organised at Wanglee Market in Kamjong District, Manipur, which lies in the border of India-Myanmar. The program was conducted with missionaries of Poumai Naga Baptist Association and Amazing Grace Mission School, Wanglee Market . The health promotion was attended by people living in village, truck drivers and students from schools and hostels.

A team visited Kangpokpi Mission Hospital in strife torn Manipur with medical supplies and equipments to support the need there.

The Outreach department also organized a one-day training program on the theme "Best Out of Waste" in collaboration with ANMA Integrated Development Association (AIDA) in AIDA Training Hall, Don Bosco Campus Dimapur, Nagaland.

In collaboration with CMC Vellore distance education department, a Training Of Trainers for Community Health Promoters Course for staff nurses and two nurses was completed with certification for Community Health Promoters Certificate Course (CHPC) Training.

Community Health Promoters Certificate Course with Kuki Baptist Convention youths was held where 24 participants completed the 1st contact program. The second contact program was organized in February 2024 and only 7 could turn up and complete the course.

Apart from these, various other training programs were conducted such as Men's fellowship health promotion, income generation skills, vocational training, community lay leaders training, cutting and tailoring program and Community Health Promoters Course.





The **Palliative Care Department** works in line with the vision of CIHSR providing accessible, affordable, inclusive, compassionate and a good quality of service. Our goal is to ensure patients and their families to receive the best possible palliative care and we ensure our work reaches health professionals, patients, care givers and the community through our outpatient department, inpatient department and home based care services.



During the year 2023-24, we could attend 1496 patients in the OPD, 76 as in-patient and 110 were reached out through the home based care service. Our partnership with the St. Joseph Palliative Care centre was continuing and 177 visits to the centre were made during the year, providing consultations and treatment for the patients receiving palliative care.

We have earned the trust and respect from our patients and their families by providing a good symptom control and best possible psychological, social and spiritual support and being transparent with them in our clear goal settings and communications.

The training programme for the home based care givers through Education department collaborating with the Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship, Guwahati continues. During the year 42 candidates were trained as a "Care-givers" for elderly people and patients with palliative care needs.

We aim to increase the awareness of palliative care among health care professionals, patients, families and in the community and reach out to many who are suffering because of life threatening illness.








The **Department of Radiation Oncology** is involved in planning and treating of cancer patients in all sub sites. We have a very strong and dedicated team of oncologist, medical physicist, technologist and staff nurse who are involved in contouring, planning and execution of treatment, educating patients in terms of chemotherapy and radiation therapy. The Ayushman and the CMHIS scheme has benefitted the patients enormously as they get free treatment in relation to chemotherapy and radiation therapy.

Highlights

We treated our patients based on the latest guidelines and recommendations for both chemotherapy and radiotherapy. We have started sending molecular studies for those cases that are indicated. We have also started using different immunotherapies and targeted therapies apart from chemotherapy. We celebrated cancer survivor day with a program on 24th June 2023, CME on Nasopharyngeal carcinoma on 14th October 2023, Cervical cancer awareness program on 30th January 2024.





Future plans

We are hoping for more services with radiologist, medical oncologist, haematologist, brachytherapy and PET CT scan for our patients. In the future, we would also like to create more awareness and preventive measures for cancer by reaching out to the communities in schools, Churches, NGOs etc. We are also working towards research and paper publications and looking ahead for applying for DNB courses in the near future.






The **Dialysis Unit** provides life-sustaining Hemodialysis (HD) Treatment to those with kidney failure, both chronic kidney disease (CKD) & acute renal failure (ARF) patients. Hemodialysis is a blood purification treatment that replaces the filtering functions of the kidneys such as the removal of excess fluid and nitrogenous wastes, and balancing acid-base values & electrolytes.

The population of patients with kidney failure has hiked enormously in the past years and the Dialysis Unit along with the wards, OPDs & ICUs have witnessed them. A total of 8638 HDs were performed from April '23 to Feb '24.

- CIHSR has the largest Hemodialysis Unit in the state, thereby-
- The highest number of HD machines
- The largest number of patients on Maintenance HD (MHD) also the largest no. of patients on MHD under CMHIS & PMJAY.
- The largest RO plant.



Upcoming projects

- The first BSc Dialysis Therapy Technology course (4 years) in the state will commence this year, approved by Nagaland University.
- SISTER RENAL CENTRE PROGRAM LEVEL B:

The International Society of Nephrology (ISN) has assigned & funded CMC Vellore's Department of Nephrology to be the Supporting Centre to CIHSR (Emerging Centre) as part of their Global Kidney Health Improvement Initiative.

The aim in 2024 is to establish the long-awaited 'Peritoneal Dialysis Unit', Training for Tunnelled Catheter Insertion, and Training for Point of Care Ultrasound in Nephrology (POCUN).

- HD Machine & Equipment: Care & Maintenance protocol- Initiated in March 2024, this project aims at training all the BSc Technologists in machine care as well as basic maintenance, record keeping & reporting systems, networking with the hospital's BME department & Machine Engineers along with developing an SOP which will be effective & standardized.
- Kangpokpi Christian Hospital Dialysis Training: We will be training a nurse from KCH for 6 months. They plan to develop their first Hemodialysis Centre.
- Minor OT: For HD/PD catheter insertions.
- Extracorporeal Blood Therapies: Plasmapheresis (Total Plasma Exchange) in ICU.
- Pediatric Hemodialysis: In collaboration with NICU/PICU.



Nursing Service Department is headed by Nursing Superintendent and 2 Deputy Nursing Superintendents. The department has 162 Registered Nurses, 36 Nursing Apprentice, 7 ANM Nursing Aid and 53 Hospital Assistants. The Registered Nurses along with the nursing apprentice and the Hospital assistants collaborate to ensure the delivery of high-quality care to patients, all aimed at ensuring optimal patient care and well-being.

The **Hospital Infection Control Department** is a multidisciplinary committee which is a crucial part of a healthcare facility's patient safety program. The scope of Hospital Infection Control Department (HIC) has a part in all areas and departments where patient care, treatment and service are rendered. Aiming to promote and facilitate the prevention and control of healthcare associated infections, strengthen antimicrobial stewardship program and there by improve the quality of patient care in the Institution.

Our objectives are:

- Active education, training and supervision of members of the health care team on aspects related to infection prevention and control practices.
- Performing active surveillance for healthcare associated infections.
- Promoting and facilitating antibiotic stewardship.
- Formulating and facilitating compliance to Infection Prevention and Control Protocols.
- Liaising with health care workers in various departments to help prevent and control hospital acquired infections.
- Ensuring that the protocols and procedures are incorporated into the Hospital Infection Control Manual, which is reviewed and revised (where necessary) at least once a year.

Hospital Infection Control Department comprises of HIC committee, HIC team and other committee/teams. Hospital infection Control Committee (HICC) consist of representatives from the Hospital and Nursing Administration along with the HIC team members.


Achievements/ Academics

The Training Education and Development Department provides service in the area of patient education (under Medicine department) and training. The patient education is provided on common health conditions to the patient coming to Medicine OPD and those admitted in Private and Medicine wards.

The nursing team in the MOPD performs all OPD patient's initial assessment, other assessment such as annual health check-up for staff and school health scheme, master health check-up. The staff also visit the schools as part of the school health activities: student's health assessments and health education.

The two trainings that are housed under this department are: Health Caregiver Course and Clinical Educator Course. The Health caregiver course is a 5-month training which is linked to the Indian Institution Engineers (IIE) Guwahati. The focus of the training is home based elderly care.

The Clinical educators course is a one-year course, started to develop nurses in the area of patient education.

The **Pharmacy Department** at CIHSR plays a pivotal role in providing essential medications and pharmaceutical services to patients seeking treatment at our institute. This annual report aims to highlight the department's activities, achievements, and initiatives undertaken over the past year.

1. Overview of Departmental Structure:

The Pharmacy Department is segmented into various sections to efficiently manage the dispensing of medications and related services:

- a. In-Patient Pharmacy: Provides medications and pharmaceutical services to all in-patients.
- b. Out-Patient Pharmacy: Serves patients visiting the hospital on an outpatient basis.
- c. Oncology Pharmacy: Specialized in providing medications for cancer patients.
- d. Pharmacy Main Store: Manages the inventory and distribution of pharmaceutical supplies.

2. Departmental Expansion

In response to the increasing patient load, the management has undertaken the following expansion. Initiatives:-

Deployment of a Runner: A dedicated runner has been deployed to deliver medications directly to the patient bedside for admitted patients. This initiative enhances the efficiency of medication delivery and improves patient experience.

3. Patient Service and Satisfaction

The Pharmacy Department remains committed to providing prompt, efficient, and compassionate service to all patients. The introduction of the runner service has significantly improved the accessibility of medications for in-patients, ensuring timely administration and enhancing overall patient satisfaction.

As we look ahead, the Pharmacy Department aims to further streamline its operations, enhance medication management processes, and explore opportunities for collaboration and innovation to meet the evolving needs of our patients and community. Additionally, the department endeavors to introduce a Diploma in Pharmacy course.





Health Information Management (HIM)

The **Health Information Management (HIM) Department** is responsible for managing and safeguarding patient health information.

The departments play a pivotal role in ensuring the accuracy, accessibility, and confidentiality of medical records while adhering to regulatory standards and best practices. Currently, the department is engaged in the process of scanning Inpatient charts and is planning to implement a comprehensive EMR system in the near future.



The hospital operates with a total of 207 inpatient functional beds as of March 2024 Statistics and 16 bassinets. These beds are distributed across various wards, including surgical- 28 beds, Medicine- 28 beds, Pediatric-17, under CICU- NICU- 6 beds and PICU-6 beds, Special-12 beds, Private- 42 beds, Labour -16 beds, ICU - 16 beds), Oncology - 18 beds, ICCU - 6 beds.

Additionally, we manage a Bachelor's program in Health Information Management affiliated under the Nagaland University. At Present, we have a total of 8 students distributed across 4 batches enrolled in the program.

Our dedicated team of biomedical engineers and technicians diligently worked towards maintaining, calibrating, and repairing various medical devices, thereby contributing significantly to the delivery of high-quality healthcare services.

Fire & Safety

At CIHSR, the **Fire Safety Department** is headed by a fire and safety officer, who receives support from the control room staff, security personnel, and engineering team. The department aims to achieve two primary goals: preserving life and protecting property.

CIHSR consists of various buildings, including residential, educational, institutional, assembly, and business structures. Most of these buildings were constructed before 2016. Therefore, the department has developed a five-year plan strategy to fulfil the NBC2016 standards by 2028. The department also plans to collaborate with the district fire and emergency services to develop a full-fledged fire department in CIHSR.

Apart from the equipment installations, the CIHSR Fire & Safety Department also plans to conduct mock drills every three months for random departments of CIHSR and also collaborate with the district fire and emergency services department to conduct basic fire drills for the outsourced security team.





Electrical Engineering

Electrical Department at CIHSR hospital is responsible for managing and maintaining the electrical systems and equipment's within the hospital premises which includes electrical power supply, lighting systems, emergency power backup systems (DG & UPS), Solar Plant and medical equipment that require electrical power.

The department, along with NERMPI has started the Diploma in Hospital Equipment Maintenance program.

Future Plans

- To Establish a system for continuous monitoring and improvement of energy performance, installing energy meters (EM) block/department wise. Periodically reassess energy consumption and identify additional opportunities for optimization.
- To change Solar PV off grid into On-grid System.
- To upgrade DG set to 1000kva as per present load analysis Upgradation of Electrical distribution system.



Logistics

The **General Stores - Logistics Department** serves as an essential support system for all other hospital divisions, ensuring seamless operations through the oversight of procurement, storage, and distribution of both medical and non-medical supplies.

Highlights

- Enhanced efficiency and collaboration with other departments regarding indent/asset requisitions, purchase orders, GRN generation, and invoice upload processes.
- Optimization of inventory management through the monitoring of usage patterns and stock levels, leading to reduced instances of stockouts and lower inventory holding costs.
- Both the previous and current year's stocktake revealed inventory variances below 1%.
- Provided valuable data and guidance to all hospital departments for budgeting purposes in the upcoming year.



Estate, Transport & Control Room

The **Estate Management** team at CIHSR is responsible for keeping the campus clean and visually appealing. They maintain areas, including the hospital, College of Nursing, Allied Health Sciences, Students Hostel, Staff Residential Areas, Nursery, and more.

The **Control Room** is responsible for ensuring the hospital campus's safety and security. These control rooms are equipped with cutting-edge technology. The control room is manned 24/7.

The **Transport department** is critical to the proper operation of the institute. The workforce ensures that vehicles are checked, drivers are properly trained, and transportation services are efficient and dependable.









LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT



CIHSR takes strong cognizant of Leadership development for staff to help them enhance their ability and effectively perform their role in the organization.

Currently, there are 7 staff members enrolled in **Post Graduate Diploma course in Hospital Administration** offered by Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS) and **Diploma in Hospital Administration** from CMC Vellore, Distance Education department.

The **Master of Arts in Organizational Leadership (MAOL)** program provides an educational experience which focuses on specific needs faced by organizational leaders. Some of the needs addressed by the program are modelling servant leadership, with stewardship of financial and human resources, financial management and planning from a Biblical perspective, assessing cultural and economic realities of the regions the organization serves and strategic management in a world that is in constant change. One can enhance their leadership skills while remaining actively involved on the job.

About 10 staff have completed the MAOL program and 16 staff are currently pursuing the course. On completion of the program, professional goals will have to be charted out by every staff that has significant institutional impact which will then be vetted by Administrative officers' committee with a clear plan of implementation.





DNB COURSES



CIHSR was accredited for three (3) DNB Post MBBS Broad Specialty courses initiated by the National Board of Examinations & Medical Sciences (NBEMS), New Delhi in Family Medicine since 2013, General Medicine and General Surgery since 2016. DNB Post MBBS & DNB Post Diploma seats in Paediatrics were accredited in 2021 and two DNB Diplomas in Anaesthesia and Obstetrics & Gynaecology in 2022.

The institute also got accredited in January of this year 2024 in DNB Post MBBS & DNB Post Diploma seats in Anaesthesiology.

RESEARCH & STUDIES

All biomedical and health research activities conducted in CIHSR comes under the purview of the **Institutional Review Board** – CIHSR (IRB- CIHSR) regardless of the sponsorship. Guided by the universal ethical principles of Beneficence, Autonomy and Justice, the IRB-CIHSR functions to ensure quality research backed with rationality, justification and protection of the rights and safety of the human research participants. Researchers are expected to have knowledge about the institute's IRB, adhere to the underlying universal principle of protecting human research participants and acquire approval for conducting any biomedical and health research. The IRB members share the responsibility of reviewing research protocol, make sound judgement and provide solutions or recommendations for conducting research. The IRB includes Ethics and Scientific Committee, comprising a total of 23 members (Ethics = 10, Scientific = 13).

During the period, April 2023-March 2024, the IRB has reviewed a total of **45 studies**. The studies have been segregated into department-wise, status of studies and type of review, for progress monitoring and training requirements. A total of 16 studies have been submitted for review by the Diplomate of National Board (DNB) candidates, 10 studies from the Consultants, one from other department, 9 each from Allied Health Sciences (AHS) and College of Nursing (CON). Of the total 45 studies, 21 studies are ongoing, eight studies have been completed, while 13 studies were reviewed by the IRB but was not undertaken. Depending on the type of study, IRB provides two types of review - Expedited and Full Board. Among the studies that were reviewed by the IRB, a total of three studies have been published.

A total of six studies have been submitted and reviewed by the IRB- Two studies are funded projects by Indian Council of medical Research (ICMR) which are to be conducted over a period of three years, One study is funded through the CMC Vellore & Mission Network Collaborative Research Grant (CMCV&MNC Grant), and three studies are carried out in collaboration with NIHR Global Health Research Unit in Surgery.





The **Accounts and Finance team** is responsible for the historical recording of transactions, cash management, vendor management, payroll disbursement budget forecasting and monitoring, and compliance of all regulatory obligations.

Highlights

1. Networking:

- i. Instrumental in facilitating bank funding for the purchase of MRI from WGE.
- ii. Hosted a webinar series in Finance and Administration under Skill Development Series, for Healthcare Administrators in the Northeast region.
- iii. Represented the Institution in the Finance and Administration workshop organized for the network hospitals by CBCNEI as a resource person.

2. Systems:

- i. Facilitated the installation of POS machines from Pine Labs for convenient payment by patients.
- ii. Prepared and disseminated SOP for credit card transactions.

3. Staff Development:

- i. The Accounts Manager attended a 2-week residential training on Healthcare Management Development Program organized by Christian Medical Association of India.
- ii. Two staff attended workshop on Income Tax and GST organized by GoN.

4. Cross Functional Support:

- i. Facilitated the staff to comply with the requirement of the Income Tax Act by conducting workshop for batches.
- ii. Supported various departments of the hospital in organizing CME and Symposiums.
- iii. Conducted an orientation for the HODs of all departments in the process of preparation of budgets.
- iv. Supported the Stores and Pharmacy with systems, workflow processes and stock verifications.
- v. Motivated the Billing department with emphasis on their contribution as individuals and as a department to the Hospital.

In 2024-25 we plan to revise the existing finance manual and to disseminate the same to all the staff of CIHSR.
